I want to give special thanks to Denny Michali and Matt Dylewski for all their help this year. We are looking for someone to take over as match director assistant-in-training so that Rob can take over and I can step down and do other duties within the Practical Pistol division.

I hope that you are surviving this winter and that we are hopefully almost rid of it. Although the weather hasn't been that bad, the Gem City Practical Shooters are heating it up on the range!

On Saturday, April 7th, we will kick off our summer schedule. Matches are held on the weekends when the first Sunday of the month occurs. Weather permitting, all the stages will be set up outside. We will need help setting up and tearing down matches, so your help will be greatly appreciated.

Set-up is on Saturday starting at 7AM so that we can get the first squad started by 9AM. Anyone assisting with set-up and tear-down will receive match credits.

So far this year we have had a terrific turnout indoors and I hope the spring and summer weather will bring more of you out to try your hand at Practical Shooting, and the shooting will be even more exciting now that we can go outdoors and spread out.

Online squading has been working well and will continue for the outdoor matches, with the exceptions of squading times: we will be starting 4 squads on Saturday at 9AM and 12:30AM, and 4 squads on Sunday at 8:30AM and 12:00 noon. We use a shotgun start format.

If you are interested in coming out to shoot all you need to do is show up! I will make sure you have all the info you need before you start, including a safety briefing as well as addressing equipment concerns. I will also make sure you will be coached during your first match so you can be as prepared as possible.

JUNIOR RIFLE Dean Allred



APRIL SHOWERS BRINGS OUT THE High Power Rifle Shooters. It wouldn't be any fun if the weather were always warm and dry.

As in the past the goal of the Club is to attract new shooters to the sport. Everybody is welcome to come out and watch or try your hand. Don't think that you have to shoot fantastic scores or have the best equipment to have fun. If you don't have a rifle the Club has several that are available. Also, for the promotion of the sport some of the past and present rifle team members have been working with the Junior Rifle team to help get them interested in shooting High Power Rifle

competition.

Special Note: CMP and NRA have Approved the use of scoped AR-15 Rifles to be shot in the National Match course of fire. Check the CMP Rules for power of scope and weight of rifle.

Our season will start April 15th with our annual range maintenance. The work party will begin at 9AM and will end when the work is completed. Our first match of the season will be on April 22nd - sign-in will begin at 7:30AM with the first relay starting at 8AM. The second relay will begin about 10AM after the completion of the first relay, and the third will begin at noon.

Course of fire will be:

- 3 sighting shots any position in 3 minutes
- 10 shots off hand slow fire in 10 minutes
- 10 shots rapid fire from sitting or kneeling in 60 seconds
- 10 shots rapid fire prone in 70 seconds
- 20 shots slow fire prone in 20 minutes

John C Garand and Springfield matches are shot in conjunction with the National Match Course. F Class Centerfire and Rimfire are shot from sand bags and are both 30-shot matches.
